Dear Mr. Damon:

On behalf of Princeton University I am sending this letter, in order to ask you to give formal approval to the budget which has been drawn up for the Colloquium on Islamic Culture.

As you will remember, a contract was signed between the Department of State and Princeton University, September 2, 1952, placing at the disposal of the University \$20,000.00 for the organization and administration of the Colloquium on Islamic Culture. At the same time, the Department of State assigned \$5,000.00 as a supplementary sum to be used for contingencies and Washington expenses in connection with the Colloquium.

At a meeting of the Colloquium committee in Washington on May 4, 1953, at which Mr. Roy P. Basler represented the Library of Congress and at which were present the following members of the Department of State - Mesars. Damon, Cleland, Wright, Sanger, Ware, O'Boyle and Miss Dudgeon - it was agreed that the extra sum of \$5,000.00 could be drawn upon in order to make it possible to send overseas on Colloquium business Professors Hitti and Thomas of Princeton. Accordingly, the budget of the Colloquium has been revised according to the estimates attached. As these estimates definitely envisage using the \$5,000. set aside by the Department to supplement the original grant of \$20,000.00 to Princeton, I am writing this letter to ask that formal confirmation of this arrangement should be made. Please, therefore, ask the proper authority of the Department of State to sign a statement authorizing me, as Director of the Colloquium, to use the supplementary sum of \$5,000.00 in addition to the \$20,000.00 granted to Princeton. The signed letter will be filed with the Treasurer of Frinceton. The Treasurer of the University can then authorize the Colloquium to draw upon the sum of \$25,000.00, instead of the original \$20,000.00.

I understand from the Library of Congress representative that the Library would prefer to have the Colloquium management handle all of the funds and make all of the payments through the Princeton office, rather than to have the Treasurer of the Library of Congress responsible for drawing checks and paying out cash.
