- 1) Our objectives for The Moscow discussions were:
- ① to seek agreement on a framework for the SALT II negotiations
  - ② to discuss other arms control issues; and
  - ③ to review other matters of mutual concern such as The M.E, Africa, Berlin, Cyprus & Bulgaria.
- 2) My general assessment is that the meetings ~~were~~ both useful and necessary.
- 3) <sup>Re SALT</sup> We have resumed the negotiating process which will <sup>be</sup> continuing in the near future.
- 4) All have to remember <sup>the process of</sup> arms control is not for the short-sighted or the faint hearted.

I regret that some inaccuracies ~~and~~ <sup>and</sup> reporting ~~has~~ <sup>has</sup> given an erroneous impression of my views.

- 5) I believe that we have put a very fair and constructive proposal on the table. I hope the Soviets will agree when they reflect on them.
- I am not depressed or downhearted in any way. Things turned out just about as we had expected.

Numbers are only part of the proposal -  
We have also been seeking to <sup>begin to</sup> get at  
the root of the security apprehensions  
on both sides ]
