Soviet Union

- 1) Going at a time of uncertainty in our relations -
- 2) SALT is key: We are ~~down~~ down to a handful of issues, but they are hard. We are not working ^{at} any ~~and~~ but would like to see progress.
- 3) If there is progress in SALT this would lead to a Summit - which would open broad discussion on bilateral and ~~other~~ issues
- 4) Slow but steady progress in other arms control talks.
- 5) Still ~~some~~ rough spots in our bilateral relation -

Problems 1) summer have largely abated -
(Crawford case, journalists.)

However, dissident trials have left bad

aftertaste - Soviets extremely displeased over sentencing faults of Nato - could spark some action e.g. American ^{Cuban Council} Council

In trade US - USSR Trade is moving to forward with some 28 projects (10-20 billion)

Council will meet in Dec just after

US - Soviet Joint Commission meeting

attended by Blumenthal & Karpis.

Trade grew about ~~promptly~~ in 72-76
dropped in 1977 - climbing back in 1978.

Global.

- 1) Looking out from Moscow - They have many problems - about which they have strong apprehensions.
 - a) Eastern Europe - Poland, EG: Czech, Hungary, Rumania (worried about nationalist tendencies)
 - b) China - Obsessed with dangers of a more vigorous China - Japan - drawing closer
- 2) Moving out to the next ring of circle
 - a) Europe - growing stronger - NATO attempts at improving relations w/ FR.Germany
 - b) M.E. - Feel they have lost ground in Arab area - Arab-Israeli
Possible: coalition Iraq-Iran-Syria - (Baptist - similar intermediate view)

3). Africa:

Mixed bag - gained some ground - lost elsewhere - I.E. Egypt-Sudan, Somalia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau -

- a) Horn - calmer than yr ago - Cuban & Sov. still present -

Focal factors such as Arafat support for Eritreans + uncertainty in Ogaden - constrain Sov. behavior.

b) Central

 - (i) Sov's have not sought to actually block in Namibia - but have been actively helpful
