sent me "clearly releasable portions" of the audit reports on May 30. I am now requesting the entire reports.

In her letter accompanying the information release, wrote: "Portions not enclosed would likely be exempt from mandatory disclosure pursuant to FOIA subsections 4 and 5 of 5 USC (b). Subsection 4 protects certain trade secrets and commercial or financial information received from a private source when disclosure is likely to cause substantial competitive harm to the source. Subsection 5 protects pre-decisional opinions and recommendations that were not incorporated into a final decision."

I would like to address the first consideration, subsection 4. In its recent interviews with government officials, analysts and reporters concerning its desire to be bought by General Dynamics, Newport News Shipbuilding has made it clear that there is no more competition in the type of Navy shipbuilding it does. Newport News Shipbuilding Chairman and Chief Executive Officer has made it clear that there is no competition regarding the large-deck nuclear aircraft carriers because no other company makes such ships. Also, he said, because of the teaming agreement with General Dynamics' Electric Boat Division, there is no more competition

for Navy nuclear submarine building. I have enclosed copies of articles from *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *Jane's Defence Weekly* and *The Wall Street Journal*. If there is no competition, then there's likely no chance for competitive harm from the release of this information.

As for subsection 5, we of course understand your concerns and we acknowledge the need for such exemptions.

As you know, the Act permits you to reduce or waive the fees when the release of the information is considered as "primarily benefiting the public." I believe that this request fits that category and I therefore ask that you waive any fees.

As the yard is a major federal defense contractor accountable for billions of dollars in taxpayers' money, the *Daily Press* believes that the knowledge of these audits and the release of this information are in the public's best interest.

If all or part of this request is denied, please cite the specific exemption(s) that you think justifies your refusal to release the information and inform me of your agency's administrative appeal procedures available to me under the law.

I would appreciate your handling this request as quickly as possible, and I look forward to hearing from you within 20 working days, as the law stipulates.
