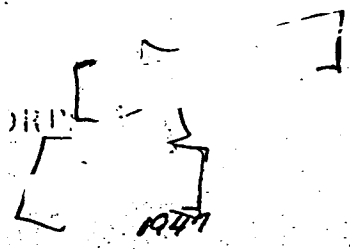

INTERROGATION REPORT

SUBJECT: EICHL, Vera.

Interrogation of parents and brother of SS  
Obersturmbannführer Otto ADOLF EICHMANN

1. Reference is made to 1010, Linz Sub-Section,  
dated 12 December 1946, Subject as above, wherein it is stated  
that subject was interviewed regarding the location of her  
ex-husband, Stabssturmführer Otto Alfred EICHMANN. Two  
leads as to EICHL's whereabouts are given in this report -  
one to EICHL's family in Linz, and the other to EICHL, Inu, at  
the Reichsheim, near Linz.

2. Attached hereto, is translation, in a report of  
her location for this Sub-Section by the Stabspolizei, Linz,  
Stabskommando's parents and brother, Friedrich, all in Linz. This  
report states in substance that EICHL's parents also do not  
know where he is located. His brother, Friedrich, likewise  
does not know of his whereabouts. Friedrich further  
states that he believes his brother Otto died to be dead,  
since the latter is supposed to have made the statement at one  
time that he was going to join the Wehrmacht, and would kill himself.  
Friedrich further states in this report that he presumes  
that his brother, Otto Alfred, was not able to leave his  
organization in Prague, Czechoslovakia, at the time of the  
surrounding in 1945.

3. This agent worked with the Reichsheim in Linz,  
the Volksgemeinschaft in Linz, the Volksdeutsche Buchstelle  
of the Reichsheim, and the Linz Volksgemeinschaft, but could  
not locate the EICHL family mentioned in the above-mentioned  
report, nor the Sub-Section.

4. Investigation conducted in this area has revealed  
no further information of interest.

5. The parents of Otto Adolf EICHMANN have been  
located and interviewed at the Reichsheim in Linz, and it was  
determined that they do not know where their son is located.  
The brother of Otto Adolf EICHMANN, Friedrich, has been  
located and interviewed at the Reichsheim in Linz, and it was  
determined that he does not know where his brother is located.

SUBJECT: Possibility of Capture of Adolf Eichmann

1. Enclosed herewith is the reporter's note of the statements made by Dr. Wilhelm Hoettl on 25 November 1946, at the time he testified in evidence for the Prosecution of the Jews case.

2. The enclosed digest of Dr. Hoettl's statements reveal that Adolf Eichmann could likely be captured by the proper United States authorities by following up the leads made in said statements. Eichmann was the Chief of the Jewish Section of the Gestapo and at least partly responsible for the extermination of about 6,000,000 Jews.

3. It is recommended that this statement be turned over to the proper officer for action. Dr. Hoettl has requested that his name not be mentioned for fear of retaliation against his family in Budapest by said Eichmann.

SUBJECT: EICHMANN, Adolf  
SS-Obersturmbannfuhrer

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

This Agent has recently received through an intermediary the following information on Subject from Frau Baldur von SCHIRACH, who is reputedly a personal enemy of EICHMANN. Subject, a right-hand man of HITLER and CO of the infamous Sonderkommando EICHMANN, a "Jew-extermination" unit, is one of the most important war criminals still at large.

Subject, popularly believed dead, is living incognito somewhere in the Oberbayern area of Germany. The parents of his wife, named LIEBEL or LIEBIG, are owners of an Eisenwarenhandlung in Linz, Oberosterreich. His wife, with whom he is allegedly in contact, lives at present under her maiden name (as above) in Alt Aussee, Oberosterreich.

AGENT'S NOTES:

Frau von SCHIRACH is reported to have received the information above from one Oberst JAARI (fmr), during a conversation with him at Meranberg. JAARI is not known to this office.

It is recommended that this information be brought to the attention of OIC, Oberosterreich Section, and OIC, USFET.

NAME: RICHARDS, ALBERT

REASON FOR: Last chief of Abteilung IV-A/4. Chief of the Jewish section of the Gestapo and at least partly responsible for the extermination of about 8,000 Jews.

FOSSILS: Last, probably fled into the Austrian Alps. ... to his whereabouts may be obtained through his ... The owned a small manufacturing plant in a small village in the Austrian Alps. This plant was sold to the State between 1942 and 1944, and Subject was subjected to a disciplinary trial for his intervention in the transaction. Through this transaction the name of Subject's sweetheart may be determined, since the register of the Gewerbe-Kammer (Trade Chamber) in ... is not voluminous and a sale of a small factory to the State can easily be located. The names of the woman and the village would serve as starting points for the search for Subject, as informant is convinced that he would stay with his sweetheart and not with his wife, with whom he entertained no intimate relationship.

OTHER DATA: Subject may be passing as a Jewish immigrant in some foreign country, since he has sufficient foreign papers, and also could be mistaken for a Jew. His command of English and German is not so fluent because he has not used these languages for quite some time. Subject is an excellent mountaineer and used to spend his vacations in Upper Austria.
