SOURCE INFORMATION

SOU: [redacted] then pulled a letter in Hebrew from [redacted] out of his pocket relating to the EICHMANN case. He said he regretted very much not having time to translate it and would not be able to give me a full translation before he left but he read it and translated as he read. He said he would ask [redacted] to give me a short summary in English of the questions contained in the letter so that I would have a record of what was in it.

TEXT OF E

[redacted] was inquiring about the position of Dr. SCHUELE, who had recently made a statement to the papers indicating that he was tracing EICHMANN documents in the United States for the West German government. [redacted] wanted to know whether this was a new source of material or whether it was the same material which we were in the course of searching. He mentioned particularly that Schuele had stated that he had come across records dealing with ABT IV B4 which was in the period 1942 to 1944. This was different and subsequent to the ABT 112.2 documents from which we had already furnished material. I told [redacted] that we knew about Schuele and that the material he was looking at was the same five miles of captured German documents that our two people were searching; that as the German government was theoretically legal owner of the documents of which the United States had custody, Schuele would have unlimited access unless we chose to classify a document and make it impossible to see. I said that although it would be difficult to keep track of everything Schuele looked at, at least we could have a try and give him a list and copies of any documents which Schuele had copied. [redacted] said this would be fine. He did not want to take the position of preventing Schuele from seeing any documents, but he would like to know what documents were made available to him.

He also asked about the legal position of these documents, whether the Government of Israel could have access to them and request certified copies therefrom to be used in the trial. He said that the copies we had sent were fine for leads in interrogation but they might need some of them to be introduced as evidence in which case they would have to be certified as true copies by the legal custodians thereof. I said: I would look into this angle for him.</p>				
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
