4. The President recalled his experience living in Gustemala in 1954 and said he believed there were some relevant lessons from the overthrow of Arbenz.

5. The President stated his deep conviction that there could be no real security for Honduras as long as the present regime ruled in Hicaragua. He believed that the Sandinistan were no less valuerable than Jacobo Arbenz. The Micaraguan people would bring them down if given the chance. Summo noted that he shared these thoughts only

6. COMMENT: I don't share Suazo's view of the aptness of the Arbenz analogy. The Sandinistas would appear to have better and tighter control of the State apparatus. Suazo's remarks do, however, bring home a point that he and other top Hondurans have been making for a long time, namely that there is an urgency . in Nicaragua from Honduras' point of view. If situation drags on indefinitely, then Sandinistas will have time to consolidate and revolutionary violence in Honduras will continue to escalate.
