SUBJECT: INFORMATION: Pakistan DC Meeting on June 12

The purpose of the meeting is to prepare for President Musharraf's June 24-26 visit to Washington. The DC discussion papers are attached at Tab 1. There are two issues to discuss: 1) the USG messages to Musharraf during the visit; and 2) the deliverables for Musharraf's visit.

MESSAGES TO MUSHARRAF

The primary points recommended by the Department of State to raise with Musharraf are: 1) reiterate U.S. commitment to a long-term relationship with Pakistan; 2) encourage continued improvement in Pakistan/India relations; 3) stress the need to stop infiltration across the Kashmir Line-of-Control and close militant training camps; and 4) encourage the ongoing transformation of Pakistan into a more democratic, moderate and progressive Islamic country.

Other points that can be made during the Musharraf visit:

- Pakistan's role in the war against terror; and
- Pakistan's role in stabilizing Afghanistan and stopping the infiltration of anti-Karzai government forces from Pakistan into Afghanistan.

DELIVERABLES TO MUSHARRAF

There is a strong sentiment both with the USG and Pakistan that we must provide significant deliverables to Musharraf to demonstrate our commitment to U.S./Pakistan relations and to strengthen Musharraf's credibility in Pakistan. The major deliverable under consideration is a \$2.5 billion plus multi-year economic and military assistance package. The main components of the package are \$200 million per year in ESF and \$200 million or more per year in FMF.

Discussion of issue involving ESF portion of possible economic and military assistance package.

The issue of the FMF component of the package may also be discussed. The main issue is whether to provide F-16 fighters to Pakistan. Issue concerning the provision of F-16s.

NSC DISCUSSION PAPER PAKISTAN STRATEGY

The deputies will meet to discuss Pakistan in preparation for President Musharraf's June 24-26 visit to Washington. The Pakistani President will be in the United States at a time of both promise and trouble. With India, the thaw initiated by Prime Minister Vajpayee's speech in April continues, and all indications are that Musharraf is committed to moving this process forward, provided that Kashmir will be included among the topics for discussion with New Delhi.

The situation inside Pakistan, however, is troublesome. The Parliament is deeply divided, with opposition forces clamoring for a number of concessions to which Musharraf is unlikely or unwilling to agree, such as giving up his position as Commander-in-Chief. Islamist forces are taking advantage of the turmoil to push their agenda, and have promulgated Sharia Law in one province.

[The consensus within Pakistan's political circles to support U.S. policies is not absolute.]

Recent polls indicate that public support in Pakistan for the war on terror is now only 20 percent and that two-thirds of Pakistanis have an unfavorable opinion of the United States.

Discussion of encouraging Musharraf to strengthen moderate Islam; act against terrorism; continue to address non-proliferation concerns; and move toward democracy.

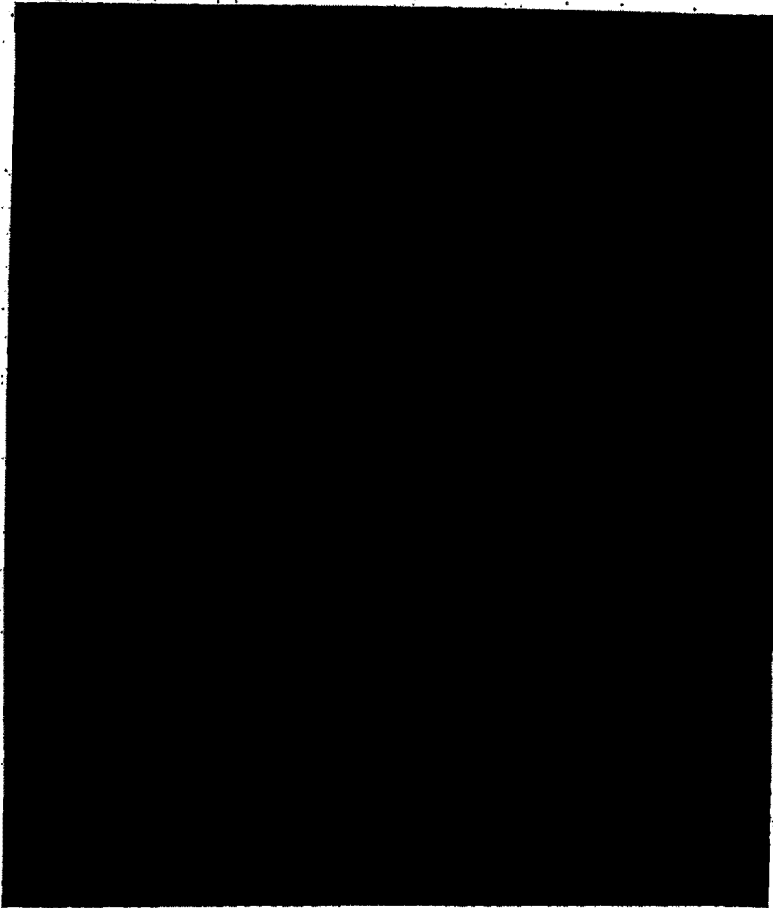

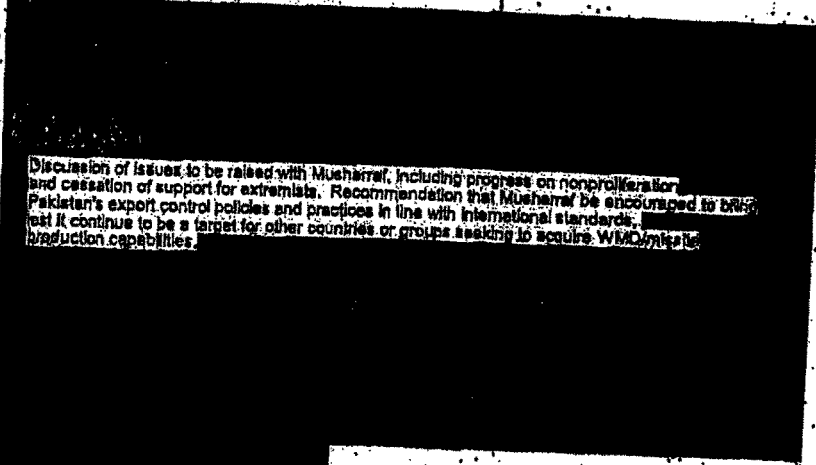
Pakistan PCC Meeting-- Musharraf Visit
"Tough" Messages - Content and Strategy
Initial Discussion Paper
Friday, June 6, 2003 11:30 A.M.

Background: President Musharraf will visit Washington June 24-27, after a stop in London. His U.S. sojourn will include a June 24 Casp David visit, and pre- and post-D.C. visits to Boston and Los Angeles respectively. Musharraf last visited in September 2002, meeting with the President on the margins of the UNGA. Deputy Secretary Armitage last met Musharraf in Islamabad May 8, urging the GOP to advance Indo-Pak rapprochement by redoubling efforts to stop militant infiltration and shut down training camps.

Visit objectives: Demonstrate U.S. commitment to broaden and deepen the bilateral relationship. [support Musharraf's effort to strengthen cooperation with the United States]

Deliverables package must include a multi-year assistance program to support Pakistan's goal of developing into a moderate, modern Muslim state. Must [support efforts]

[support efforts] to fight terrorism, honor pledges to prevent WMD/NP transfers and have no arms-related contacts with North Korea, and continue the process of restoring civilian democracy.



Discussion of issues to be raised with Musharraf, including progress on nonproliferation and cessation of support for extremists. Recommendation that Musharraf be encouraged to bring Pakistan's export control policies and practices in line with international standards, and that it continue to be a target for other countries or groups seeking to acquire WMD/nuclear production capabilities.

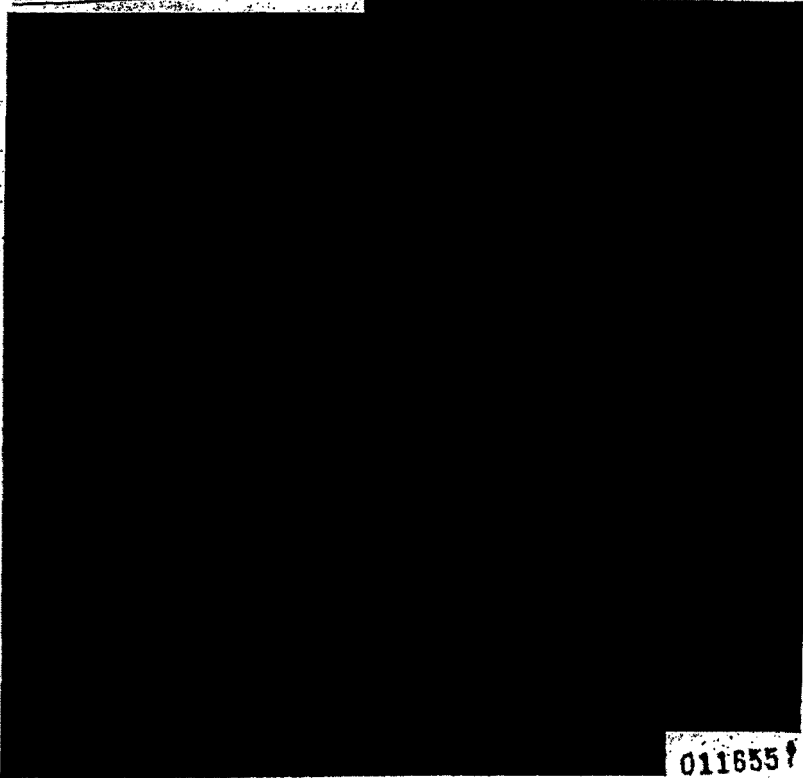

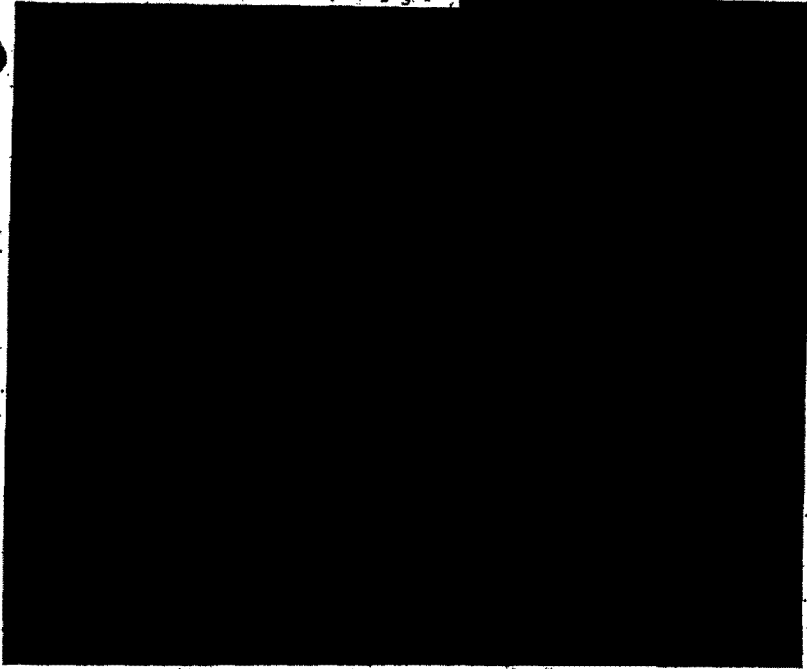
