3: (U) SUMMARY: FOLLOWING THEIR BILATERAL MEETING (SEPTEL), THE SECRETARY HOSTED PAKISTAN FOREIGN MINISTER ABOUL SATTAR AT LUNCH ON JUNE 19, 2001. THE SECRETARY TOLD SATTAR THAT THE USG WAS CONDUCTING A REVIEW OF THE OVERALL SANCTIONS POLICY, AND THAT PAKISTANI PROGRESS ON ISSUES OF CONCERN TO US WOULD BE HELPFUL IN DEALING FAVORABLY WITH SANCTIONS.

4. THE SECRETARY EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE TALIBAN AND ITS THREAT TO REGIONAL STABILITY AS IT TRIES TO SPREAD ITS IDEOLOGY. SATTAR, AZIZ KHAN, AND GENERAL JILANI ENCOURAGED ENGAGEMENT WITH THE TALIBAN RATHER THAN ISOLATION. THEY PAINTED THE TALIBAN LEADERSHIP AS YOUNG, UNEDUCATED MEN, WHOSE EXPERIENCES ARE LIMITED TO STRUGGLE AND WAR, AND WHO WOULD MODERATE THEIR VIEWS ONCE THEY GAIN EXPOSURE TO THE OUTSIDE WORLD. SATTAR CHARACTERIZED THE GOP-TALIBAN AS "REASONABLE," BUT ONE WITH ITS OWN PROBLEMS -- SMUGGLING, REFUGEES, AND FUGITIVES. HE CLAIMED THAT THE GOP HAD ONLY LIMITED INFLUENCE WITH THE TALIBAN, WHICH LISTENS BUT ACTS IN ITS OWN INTERESTS. SATTAR DESCRIBED THE PAKISTAN-CHINA RELATIONSHIP AS ONE OF FRIENDSHIP AND TRUST.

### SANCTIONS

5. CONCLUDING A CONVERSATION THAT HAD BEGUN BEFORE LUNCH, THE SECRETARY TOLD SATTAR THE SANCTIONS WERE UNDER REVIEW, AND WE WOULD SEE WHAT COULD BE DONE. THE SECRETARY EXPLAINED THAT SANCTIONS OFTEN ARE A SUBSTITUTE FOR EVEN MORE PUNITIVE ACTIONS. MEANWHILE, AS WE REVIEW SANCTIONS, HE SAID, IT IS IMPORTANT FOR THE GOP TO DO ITS PART BY SHOWING PROGRESS ON ISSUES OF CONCERN TO US, THUS "GIVING US AMMO" TO DEAL WITH THE ISSUE. HE NOTED THAT HE WAS A GREAT BELIEVER IN MILITARY TRAINING PROGRAMS SUCH AS
