(Unclassified - [REDACTED]) LIAISON Met with Kenneth de Graffenreid, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, who said he had been asked by the Committee to "put to bed" charges made by the father of an American, Charles Horman, who was killed in Chile in about 1972. Apparently, Horman's father is charging CIA was somehow involved. He has filed a request for documents under FOIA. De Graffenreid asked to review all Agency documents concerning Horman.

(Unclassified - [REDACTED] LIAISON Called Ken de Graffenreid, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence staff, and told him the Agency had no documents pertaining to Charles Horman, an American killed in Chile at the time of the coup against Allende. I said the Agency did have copies of Agency and State Department documents but de Graffenreid said he had already seen those. I told de Graffenreid the information I had was a few months old and I would double check to make sure there was nothing recent, but that I was quite confident there was nothing.
