SITREP COVERING PERIOD 071800Z JUN TO 080600Z JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINS TENSE AND FLUID. EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE CONTINUED OVERNIGHT IN KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, THE CITY CENTRE AND CAMP KIGALI BETWEEN THE TWO WARRING PARTIES. FIGHTING IS ALSO REPORTED AT GADDAFI CROSSING. IN THE NORTH RGF IS STILL IN CONTROL OF RUHENGERRI. IN THE SOUTH RPF CONTINUE TO ISOLATE GITARAMA. NUMBER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUE TO RISE IN BUTARE AND CYANGUGU IN THE SOUTH. IN KIGALI CITY RPF CONTINUE TO ISOLATE AND TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON RGF POSITIONS. GENDARMERIE CONTINUE TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS IN THE CITY. DFC WILL RETURN LATER IN THE DAY BY ROAD FROM UGANDA. THE RESUPPLY CONVOY THAT LEFT YESTERDAY FOR UGANDA RETURNS TODAY. THE THIRD TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR THIS MORNING AT FORCE HQ. LAST EVENING, 4 ROUNDS OF 12.7mm HIT THE UNAMIR HQ. THE ROUNDS IMPACTED ON THE WALL OF THE OPS ROOM BUILDING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. IT IS REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT MUSEVENI OF UGANDA IS ADVISING THE RPF TO AGREE FOR CEASE FIRE AND NEGOTIATE FOR A POLITICAL SOLUTION TO THE RWANDESE CRISIS. THE HUMAN RIGHTS INVESTIGATOR HAS STATED THAT ALL HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN RWANDA WITHIN THE PAST TWO MONTHS WILL BE INVESTIGATED.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUE TO PUT MORE PRESSURE AND ISOLATE RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO AND CITY CENTRE AND CAMP KIGALI. CONTINUE TO CONTROL THE ROAD KIGALI - GITARAMA AT RUNDA. ADVANCE WESTWARDS IN THE SOUTH AND DOWN TO BUTARE CONTINUES. REPORTED TO HAVE EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RGF.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO RETALIATE TO RPF FIRES WITH ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTRE, IN THE NORTH THEY ARE STILL CONTROLLING RUHENGERRI. CONTINUE TO CONSOLIDATE THEIR POSITIONS IN THE SOUTH AND REINFORCING AT GITARAMA.

C. MILITIA. ONLY A FEW ARE PRESENT IN THE CITY.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. NORMAL BRIEFING OF STAFFS TOOK PLACE AT 1900. DFC RETURNS TO KIGALI TODAY BY ROAD FROM KAMPALA. TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETING BETWEEN RPF AND RGF IS SCHEDULED FOR TODAY 08 JUN 1994 AND WILL BE CHAIRED BY THE FC. THE CONVOY THAT LEFT YESTERDAY FOR KABALE TO BRING RESUPPLIES RETURNS TO KIGALI TODAY.

- B. UDOMVE. AREA OF OPERATION IS CALM. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.
- C. KYUBAT. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT SECURITY DUTIES AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIA GENERAL AREA AND THE RUNWAY.
- D. TUM PLATOON (+). AREA OF OPERATION RELATIVELY CALM. PROVIDED SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT MILLE COLLINS HOTEL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.
- E. MILOR ORGANIZATION, PLANNING AND COORDINATION OF MILOBE ACTIVITIES WAS CARRIED OUT. THE SECTOR COMD AND HIS PATROLS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND WILL RETURN TO MULINDI LATER.
5. UNCIVPOL. 15 ARE STILL IN NAIROBI.
6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE TO MORE SECURE AREAS REMAINS SUSPENDED DUE TO INSECURITY AND LOGISTICS PROBLEMS. THE NUMBER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUE TO RISE AND THEREBY NECESSITATING THE NEED FOR MORE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.
