TEXT: 1. (C/NF) RECENT EVENTS, AS A RESULT OF THE ENFORCEMENT OF MARTIAL LAW IN BEIJING, COULD HAVE FAR-REACHING ADVERSE EFFECTS ON SINO-US RELATIONS.

2. (C/NF) A FOREIGN MINISTRY SPOKESMAN HAS STATED THAT WASHINGTON'S DECISION TO SUSPEND ARM SALES TO CHINA IS A DETRIMENT TO BILATERAL RELATIONS (b)(1),1.4 (c)

IN ADDITION, PROBABLY IN RESPONSE TO THE US ACTION, FOREIGN MINISTER QIAN QICHEN HAS REPORTEDLY CANCELED HIS 12 THROUGH 14 JUNE TRIP TO WASHINGTON.

3. (C/NF) THE US EMBASSY AND CONSULATES IN CHINA ARE RECEIVING AN INCREASING NUMBER OF REQUESTS FOR POLITICAL ASYLUM FROM STUDENTS OR OTHER POLITICAL DISSIDENTS. THE PRESENCE IN THE US EMBASSY OF FANG LIZHI, WHO IS THE MOST CELEBRATED INDIVIDUAL IN CHINA'S DISSIDENT MOVEMENT, IS OF PARTICULAR CONCERN. CHINESE SECURITY PREVENTED FANG FROM ATTENDING A DINNER HOSTED BY THE US PRESIDENT LAST FEBRUARY. THE INCIDENT NOT ONLY OVERSHADOWED OTHER EVENTS OF THE VISIT BUT ALSO CREATED AN AWKWARD SITUATION FOR BOTH COUNTRIES.

SINCE LATE LAST MONTH, BEIJING HAS BECOME INCREASINGLY CONCERNED AND SUSPICIOUS ABOUT WHAT IT PERCEIVES AS US INVOLVEMENT IN THE STUDENT DEMONSTRATIONS. MOREOVER, US NEWS MEDIA COVERAGE OF THE DEMONSTRATORS, INCLUDING COVERAGE OF THE ARMY'S (b)(1),1.4 CLEARING OF TIANANMEN SQUARE, HAS ALSO UNDOUBTEDLY AFFECTED RELATIONS.
