As the most important thing is to be sure that references to visas and Leader Grants are correct, Huntington Damon is to correspond about revisions, which are necessary. Accordingly, if you have any suggestions, please send them to Damon's office immediately.

Saturday, I had lunch with Bill Eddy and he said that he understands ARAMCO cannot transport non-company passengers because of agreements with the commercial airlines, *but of course Aramco can pay - other ways.*

As agreed in the committee meeting, I will write to Pan American, TWA and American Export to ask if they would like to provide any tickets.

If ARAMCO does help us, we had better notify Gulf and ask if the people at Kuwait would like to send a representative from their state.

A letter has just come, signed by Datus C. Smith, Jr., stating that Franklin Publications will pay for printing all of the papers in Arabic. A full copy of the letter will be sent you at a later date.
