Compensation and Pension Benefit Activity Among 464,144 Veterans Deployed to the Global War on Terror

The chart below provides information on the disability compensation and pension claim activity among veterans deployed overseas in support of the Global War on Terror (GWOT), also referred to as Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF).

Veterans of the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq may have served during a prior period. Therefore, disability claims noted below may be attributable to any of the veteran's periods of service and may not be the direct result of GWOT deployment.
